

GEOCACHING IN THE ACPD

When participating in geo-caching activities in the ACPD:

- Register for free at www.geocaching.com, where you can register all of your geo-caching finds and receive notification of new caches in your area.
- Respect nature when seeking a cache. Examples: Do not step on wildflowers or leave litter.
- You may take something out of the cache when you find it (not the logbook), but please leave something and also sign the logbook. Absolutely NO tobacco, alcohol, drugs, firearms, dangerous items, adult items or food. Small toys, coins or coupons are examples of things that are appropriate.
- Do not move a cache from its location.
- Travelers (coins and travel bugs) are items that are registered with geocaching.com and travel from cache to cache. Please do not move a traveler unless you are registered with the website and are familiar with how to log the move

Placing a cache

- To place a geocache, fill out an [ACPD geocaching permit application](#). Caches must be re-permitted every other year. Note: Crall Woods does not allow caches.
- The individual placing a cache is responsible for monitoring it. Caches should not contain food, firearms, drugs, or dangerous or adult items. Individuals may place one cache per park and/or a total of three caches throughout the ACPD.
- Caches must be within 15 feet of a trail, and have minimal/no impact on the surrounding area -- no buried caches or caches nailed to trees. If placing one at Freer Field, please avoid the disc golf course.
- All caches must be in safe containers (no ammunition boxes).
- Caches must be public -- no member only or subscription caches.
- All park rules must be followed, and hunting seasons should be noted when placing or searching for caches.
